**NEW DRUG DISCOUNT PLAN TO RELIEVE FINANCIAL
STRESS AT THE PHARMACY COUNTER**

Greene County Adopts NACo Prescription Drug Card Discount Plan, Residents To Save
Average Of 20 Percent

WAYNESBURG, PA – The Greene County Commissioners announced today that the County is adopting a discount card program to help residents cope with the high cost of prescription drugs. Greene County is making free prescription drug discount cards available under a program sponsored by the National Association of Counties (NACo) that offers average savings of 20 percent off the retail price of commonly prescribed drugs.

All County residents are eligible for the NACo prescription discount card, regardless of age, income, or existing health coverage. In addition to being accepted at participating pharmacies in Greene County, a national network of more than 57,000 participating retail pharmacies also will honor the prescription discount card.

“The NACo Prescription Drug Card Program has saved consumers all around the country \$46 million dollars on more than 4.2 million prescriptions,” said Greene County Commissioner Pam Snyder. “Starting today, we look forward to allowing the residents of Greene County to benefit from this revolutionary program.”

To receive a discount on prescriptions, an individual simply presents the card at a participating pharmacy. There is no enrollment form, no membership fee and no restrictions or limits on frequency of use.
