

Monument Locations:

❖ World War I Monument Only

This monument is located on Route 188 Jefferson Road in Waynesburg, PA. Once you get off of I-79 South, you make a right onto Route 21 East Roy Furman Highway you pass a McDonald's & a Get Go on your right. Then you come to a stop light with Bortz car dealership to your right; then turn right onto Elm Drive. This will take you to Route 188 Jefferson Road; from Elm Drive make a right onto Route 188. The monument is located on your right hand side of the road; some benchmarks are as follows: on the right hand side of the road you will see Youth Soccer Fields along with the Franklin Township Sewage Authority, before you drive under I-79, scenic but a winding road; with Ten Mile Creek along the right side of the road. Roads that you pass are as follows: Dorothy Drive, Valley Farm Road & Stripe Road these are on your left. At that point there will be a sharp curve with two houses on your left, then you will cross over Ten Mile Creek with Industrial Business on the left & the right. You will see the building for Habitat for Humanity on the left & Water Hauling Company on the right hand side, with the monument located at this point. Don't blink or you may miss it? It is decorated with Flags & the flag holder's with a tree behind the monument.

❖ Greene Township Veterans Memorial

This monument is located in the Garards Fort Cemetery in Garards Fort, PA. The monument is dedicated to all wartime veterans; Revolutionary, Civil, WWI, WW II, Korean & Vietnam. The directions to this monument are as follows: Take I-79 South to the Kirby Exit when you come to the stop sign, make a left onto SR 2018. You will then come to another stop & make a right onto Garards Fort Road – SR 2011 leading into the town of Garards Fort very small town. The cemetery will be located on the left hand side of the road; you will see the White Bridge on the right hand side of the Road. You will see a red brick home; which is the Corbly Home you will make a left hand turn before you pass this house. The cemetery was placed on this Corbly Family farmland. This is a gated cemetery.

❖ Rices Landing Community Honor Roll (includes all wartimes)

Location is in Rices Landing, PA; Jefferson Township. You would get off of I-79 South at the Ruff Creek Exit come to a stop & make a left turn onto Lippencott Road Route 221 South which leads into Route 188 East (Jefferson Road) which goes through the town of Jefferson continue on which a straight stretch to the village of Dry Tavern is. You will come to a light which crosses Route 188 & Route 88 at this point you will go straight onto Ferncliff Road at the next stop you will make a left onto Crucible Road. You will see the Hewitt Presbyterian Church & the monument is located to the left of the Church which is actually located on Carmichaels Street, with the Hewitt Cemetery located directly behind the monument.

❖ Graysville Community Honor Roll

This monument is located in the western section of the county in Gray Township in the town of Graysville. To get to this monument you will travel on Route 21 West now known as West Roy Furman Highway. Towns that you will go through are as follows: Waynesburg/Waynesburg

Borough, East View, Rogersville, and Rutan and finally into the town of Graysville. This monument is the community honor roll so it is in the center of the town of Graysville.

❖ Purple Heart Monument/Greene County Veterans Monument for all who served in the County

The location of this is in the County Seat of Greene County Waynesburg, PA. It is located on the Courthouse Lawn to the right side of the Courthouse. The courthouse is located in the center of town; being Waynesburg Borough. From I-79 South you take Route 21 (West Roy Furman Highway) right into the center of town; you go through eight (8) stop lights until you see the county courthouse on the left hand side of the road. There are two (2) monuments on the courthouse lawn; first you will see the Monument dedicated to all the Greene County Veterans who honorably served their country and on the opposite side of the lawn is the MOPH monument.

❖ Laurel Point Cemetery – 2 (Two) Monuments

The location of this monument is located in Carmichaels, PA. From I-79 South, turn left at the stop sign onto Route 21 East (East Roy Furman Highway) which you go through a lot of small towns, one would be Khedive. You will come to a flashing light (Baileys Crossroads); you continue straight on this road, which is now West George Street. Landmarks that you pass are the Carmichaels Clinic on the right then up on the left you will see the Carmichaels/Cumberland Fire Department on the left side of the road. Continue until you come to a stop sign at the stop you will see the PNC bank on your right & a gas station on your left. You continue straight then you will come to the center of town; there is a circle and you continue to circle until you pass two turn off's then take the third one which is then North Market Street. You will pass the US Post Office on the left continue straight, you will pass the Carmichaels Covered Bridge on the left & the Greene Academy of Arts on the left, you will then find the Laurel Point Cemetery on the right. At that point at the entrance of the cemetery you will find the 1st Monument which is a memorial dedicated to the memory of Spc. Gregory A. Cox who served during the Operation Iraq Freedom.

Then you take the first right and you will come to the center of the cemetery you will find a memorial dedicated to all of the service man from the Revolutionary War to the present Persian Gulf.

❖ Dreamer Memorial Park Monuments

This park is located in a remote area of the northwestern Greene County in Richhill Township. This is located off of West Roy Furman Highway (Route 21 West) through the County Seat of Waynesburg, continuing west on Route 21 into towns as East View, Rogersville continue on Route 21 watching for various landmarks such as the Scott Covered Bridge on the left side of the road, then through the town of Rutan continue on Route 21 into the town of Graysville continue on until you come to the town of Wind Ridge, now is when we get into the difficult part of the trip. Now off of Route 21 you will make a right turn onto Crabapple Road (SR 4002) towns that you will go through is are Crabapple & Durbin. This SR 4002 road turns into SR 3001. A short distance you will make a right onto SR 4003 Veterans Road; then you will make a left onto Crows Rock Road which leads you to Majorsville Road in West Finley, PA where the park is located. ??? On the location, have not been out there for many years. The monument was erected in 1935 in memory of all men who lost their lives in the Revolutionary War, 1775-1781; the Civil War,

1861-1865; the Spanish American War, 1898; and the World War, 1917-1918. These cornerstones honor sailors, soldiers, air man, marines & nurses.

❖ Veteran's Monument at the Greensboro VFW

This monument is located in Greensboro, PA in Monongahela Township. The actual location is right beside the Greensboro VFW. To get to this location is off of I-79 South, Waynesburg Exit onto SR 21 East towards Carmichaels, PA. Again at the flashing light (Baileys Crossroads) you would make a right onto East Roy Furman Highway to another light which is in Paisley at that stop you will see at Sheetz Gas Station on your left, you will make a right onto Route 88 South you will go a ways through the following towns Little Chicago, Sigsbee, Alicia and at Mapletown there will be the Mapletown Crossroads at that point you need to make a left onto SR 2014 East called Stoney Hill into the town of Greensboro continue driving with no turn off and you will come to the Greensboro VFW Post & the monument is adjacent to the building. This monument is dedicated in memory and in honor of the brave men & women of Greensboro & Monongahela Township who served their country in all of the wars.

❖ Center Township Honor Roll

To my knowledge this monument/honor roll is located in the town of Rogersville, PA.

The directions are off of I-79 South, Waynesburg Exit onto Route 21 (West Roy Furman Highway) Into Waynesburg; and East View then the Village of Rogersville, PA.
