



# Shriver Covered Bridge

**Bridge Number 30 7202 0487 2085**

The Shriver is another of the queen-post structures located in the open countryside of Greene County in Center Township, over Hargus Creek. It is covered with random-width unpainted vertical board siding on both sides and portals, has a sheet metal roof and a deck of crosswise planking. Fairly wide length-wise openings immediately under the eaves are the only side opening on the bridge.

Built in 1900, and refurbished in 1976. A simple, one-span, non-composite, concrete encased, reinforced with Steel I-Beams; resting on cut stone abutments that appear to have been laid dry and has wing-walls of similar material that extends a little above road level.

The Shriver Covered Bridge is scheduled for a \$500,000 rehabilitation (facelift); as announced in



June 2011, a federal grant is part of the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Historic Covered Bridge Preservation Program. The Shriver Covered Bridge, listed in the National Register of Historic Places, is one of seven covered bridges that remains standing within the boundaries of Greene County.
